MARY: EVERY MOTHER'S MODEL

- Mary was a young girl with an unexpected, extramarital pregnancy.
 Though her story is different (Luke 1:29, 34), some of her experiences relate. What lessons can women today learn from Mary as she was faithful to God during this difficult time?
- It was during the wedding at Cana that Mary began showing early signs of obedience to her Son as her Savior. She said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5) How are Mary's words instructive to those seeking to follow Jesus today?
- No one knows how hard it must have been for Mary to watch her own child be crucified (John 19:25). What can we learn about Mary's commitment to her Savior, and a mother's love for her child, by her physical presence at Golgotha (v. 17)?
