<p>“Lord, teach us to pray...” Jesus gave us a Pattern in the Disciples’ Prayer—Pray “in this manner” or “in this way...” Jesus spoke these words in Matthew 6:9-13 and Luke 11:1-4. Throughout His life, He continually focused on His Father, on Honoring Him, paying attention to Him, obeying Him and His will, seeking to please Him (John 5:19-20; 30; 8:26-29; 12:49-50—Read what Jesus said!). Use this Prayer Calendar to take a Journey of Honoring the Father in your life. This Prayer Calendar covers seven areas with Each Day focusing on a different prayer theme from the Disciples’ Prayer. Each Week emphasizes one of the seven themes of the Disciples’ Prayer. Each day, read the focus Scriptures and pray God’s Word for your life, family, and church, for each ministry He has given you. Pray for people you know—to truly know Jesus as Lord and Savior and Honor the Father.</p>						
<p>Week One: Honoring Our Father in Heaven—“We Honor and Hallow Your Name, Oh, Father, our Heavenly Father, the Highest, the Best, the Purest. All Glory to You.”</p>						
<p>Day 1 October 6 Our Father. Matthew 6:9. Highest Honor goes to our Heavenly Father, as Jesus showed and led us to pray. Exalt and Praise His Name.</p>	<p>Day 2 Father-King 7 Psalm 5:2-3. The LORD is “my King and my God.” To Him we pray and He answers. Call on Him every day. Expect His answers.</p>	<p>Day 3 Holy Living 8 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8. The will of God is “your sanctification,” pure living with no immorality, always honoring Him.</p>	<p>Day 4 The Father’s Food 9 John 4:31-39. Jesus was totally satisfied with the Father’s will, speaking to His disciples at Jacob’s Well.</p>	<p>Day 5 Father’s Honor 10 Luke 15:11-32. The Father reveals His glory and honor with who He forgives, in the way He forgives. So we should do the same.</p>	<p>Day 6 Our Shield 11 Genesis 15:1. Psalm 84:3, 11-12. The LORD promised Abram He would be his “shield,” a protection for him—no need to fear. He is our “King.” Trust Him.</p>	<p>Day 7 Glory Forever 12 Philippians 4:20. Glory goes to “our God and Father” forever for who He is and for all He has done and is doing. Give Him your praise and thanks.</p>
<p>Week Two: Honoring Our Father and His Kingdom—“May You be Honored as You reveal Your Kingdom.”</p>						
<p>Day 8 His Kingdom 13 1 Corinthians 15:24-28. Our “God and Father” will receive the Kingdom, “that God may be all in all.” Praise Him as God!</p>	<p>Day 9 Kingdom Come 14 Matthew 4:17; 6:10. Jesus calls us to follow Him now and pray for the Father’s full will and reign on earth.</p>	<p>Day 10 “Your will...” 15 Matthew 6:10. The Father’s will is done in heaven! So may we pray for that to be so on earth... in my life today & in others’ lives, too.</p>	<p>Day 11 Kingdom Bread 16 John 6:1-15, 26-35; 18:36. Jesus revealed Himself as the “true bread” to believe in, not temporary bread to bargain over. Believe Him!</p>	<p>Day 12 King’s Concern 17 Matthew 18:21-35; Genesis 4:23-24. The King wants hearts forgiven & forgiving, as He forgives, not as Cain’s family, unforgiving.</p>	<p>Day 13 Conquering 18 Genesis 3:15; 1 Corinthians 15:24-28. Jesus will conquer all enemies, all evil (even the serpent) and all powers and death.</p>	<p>Day 14 Never Ending 19 Daniel 7:14. The Kingdom of the Ancient of Days and the Son of Man “will not pass away” or end. He and His Kingdom endure!</p>
<p>Week Three: Honoring Our Father and His Will—“May we see You Honored by Your Will being known and done.”</p>						
<p>Day 15 His Will 20 Ephesians 1:5, 9, 11. God’s will is kind, though a mystery, marked by His wisdom and grace. Thank Him and praise His heart.</p>	<p>Day 16 Knowing 21 Daniel 4:34-37. God wants us to know He IS King and His will is supreme. He knows what is best and wants us to know Him.</p>	<p>Day 17 The Father’s Will 22 Ephesians 3:14-21. The Father wants His whole family to be empowered by His Spirit, knowing Christ’s Presence and love.</p>	<p>Day 18 Believe 23 John 6:38-48. The will of the Father was for Jesus to come as the “Bread of Life,” for each to believe in Him to have eternal life.</p>	<p>Day 19 Taught by God 24 1 Thessalonians 4:9-12. God’s will for His children: love one another in daily life, behave properly, and excel more & more in love.</p>	<p>Day 20 Protected 25 John 17:13-21. Jesus prayed God’s will for each of us—to be protected from the evil one (now and forever), walking in His Word, believing in Jesus.</p>	<p>Day 21 All You Do 26 1 Corinthians 6:19-20; 10:31-33. God’s will is for each believer to glorify God in the body—every action, eating, drinking, whatever.</p>
<p>Week Four: Honoring Our Father for His Provision—“Give us ‘bread’ so we have strength to Honor Your Name.”</p>						
<p>Day 22 Strength 27 Luke 11:3. We pray for food for strength to fully honor the Father’s Name. We thank the Father for the bread He gives and blesses.</p>	<p>Day 23 Thanks 28 Psalm 104:1, 10-28; 145:1, 8-16. The LORD, the King gives food and water, crops and rain to His creation. Honor and thank Him.</p>	<p>Day 24 Good Food 29 1 Timothy 4:3-5. God’s will is for each to receive what He gives as good with gratitude—daily food and the strength it gives.</p>	<p>Day 25 True Bread 30 John 6:32-37. Jesus is “the true bread out of heaven,” the “Bread of God” and the “Bread of Life” given by the Father. Come to Jesus.</p>	<p>Day 26 Fever Heat 31 Psalm 32:1-11. Sin drains strength like a fiery fever. We give honor to the Father as we receive His strength by His Spirit and with His forgiveness.</p>	<p>Day 27 November 1 Self-Will. Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-24. The issue in Eden was not food, but self-will, making an evil choice against God and His good Word.</p>	<p>Day 28 The Point 2 Romans 14:5-9, 17-23. Eat and drink with thanks and to glorify and honor God, not to satisfy selfishness.</p>

Week Five: Honoring Our Father and His Forgiveness—“May we Honor Your Name through being forgiven and forgiving others.”

<p>Day 29 70 X 7 3 Matthew 18:21-35. Ephesians 4:32. We forgive the way Christ has forgiven us, to the fullest. We honor the Father in this way.</p>	<p>Day 30 The King Forgives 4 Matthew 18:27, 33; Luke 7:36-50. The King showed mercy, forgiving. God shows us mercy. Thank Him. Love Him.</p>	<p>Day 31 His Father’s Will 5 Matthew 26:36-46. Jesus prayed to His Father, “<i>not as I will, but as You will.</i>” His will is forgiveness for each and each forgiving.</p>	<p>Day 32 No Shame 6 2 Kings 6:8-23. Elisha showed kindness with food rather than vengeance and death. The ‘bread’ of forgiveness gives life.</p>	<p>Day 33 Jesus Forgives 7 Luke 4:4; 23:34; 24:36-48. On the Cross and in His Resurrection, Jesus forgave sinners and their sins. Receive this. Thank Him.</p>	<p>Day 34 Sprinkled Clean 8 Hebrews 10:19-22; 1 Peter 1:2. We are sprinkled clean from an “<i>evil conscience</i>” by the work of Christ on the Cross.</p>	<p>Day 35 Abundant 9 Nehemiah 9:17; Psalm 130:4-8. God is a “<i>God of forgiveness</i>” and “<i>abundant redemption.</i>” Hope in Him.</p>
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Week Six: Honoring Our Father because of His Protection—“Deliver us from temptation, all evil, and the evil one that we may Honor Your Name.”

<p>Day 36 Faithful Lord 10 2 Thessalonians 3:3. May the Lord strengthen and protect us from the evil one. He is our Shield and Shade.</p>	<p>Day 37 Follow 11 Proverbs 5:21; Psalm 23:1-3 Our LORD watches all our paths and leads in tracks of righteousness away from evil. Follow Him.</p>	<p>Day 38 Good Will 12 Romans 16:19-20; Genesis 3:15. God’s will—Be wise in the good and innocent in evil. God will crush the serpent and all evil.</p>	<p>Day 39 Food for Good 13 Romans 14:13-23. Food is good, but can be evil if it hurts a “<i>brother.</i>” Let all be done in love by the Spirit for Kingdom good.</p>	<p>Day 40 Caution 14 2 Corinthians 2:5-11. Be cautious of Satan’s schemes to inflame unforgiveness. By God’s Word, forgive fully, comfort and love others.</p>	<p>Day 41 Way of Escape 15 Matthew 6:13; Luke 11:4; 1 Corinthians 10:12-14; Jeremiah 6:16. Look to God to lead into His good way, away from temptation.</p>	<p>Day 42 Like Father 16 Matthew 5:43-48. Like the Father loves and gives, you love and give. Pray for those who oppose. Reveal the Father to others.</p>
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Week Seven: Honor and Glory Go to Our Father forever—“May You be Honored above All, all glory going to You, our Heavenly Father.”

<p>Day 43 Glory Forever 17 Daniel 4:37; 1 Timothy 1:17. The Eternal King deserves eternal honor and glory. Boast about Him. Praise Him and Thank Him.</p>	<p>Day 44 True Worship 18 Genesis 22:1-19. God saw Abraham’s obedience as true worship—His will, the fear of God, withholding nothing, obeying promptly.</p>	<p>Day 45 His Will 19 Romans 12:1-2. We express our trust in God through surrender and He reveals His good, well-pleasing, goal-reaching will.</p>	<p>Day 46 Daily Bread 20 Matthew 6:11; Luke 11:3; 1 Peter 4:7-11. We receive bread to gain strength with which we can give glory to God, honoring Him.</p>	<p>Day 47 Rich in Grace 21 Ephesians 1:3, 6-8. God blessed us with the lavish “<i>riches of His grace,</i>” the full forgiveness of our sins.</p>	<p>Day 48 Kept by God 22 1 John 2:15-17; 5:18-20. The world and its lusts influenced by the evil one are all passing. Those born of God are kept by God.</p>	<p>Day 49 Boast in Him 23 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 6:13. Remember where you came from, how He changed you. Boast in Him. Give all glory to Him!</p>
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Week Eight: “Amen!”—“To You, Heavenly Father, may our lives from this day forward and forever show Honor, saying “Amen,” Truly, Surely, Certainly, all Honor goes to You!”

<p>Day 50 “Amen!” 24 2 Corinthians 1:20. “<i>The promises of God</i>” are enacted because of Jesus, His work and power. We say “Amen,” “yes,” “I agree,” to the honor of God.</p>	<p>Your Journey... When Jesus’ disciples asked Him, “<i>Lord, teach us to pray,</i>” they were admitting that they did not know how to pray like HE did. Some of them had been disciples of John the Baptist who taught his disciples to pray (Luke 11:1), but even they saw a difference. Jesus prayed often. He prayed at His baptism (Luke 3:21), sometimes “<i>alone</i>” (Luke 9:18), at His Transfiguration (Luke 9:28), as well as “<i>often</i>” slipping away “<i>to the wilderness</i>” to “<i>pray</i>” (Luke 5:16). Jesus did not give His disciples a special prayer to “<i>say,</i>” something to quote or a memorized ritual. He gave them a “<i>pattern,</i>” an “<i>in this way</i>” explanation (Matthew 6:9). We have the same need to be taught. Today, the Holy Spirit “<i>helps our weakness</i>” because “<i>we do not know how to pray as we should</i>” (Romans 8:26). He will guide us using the Word of God and what Jesus has taught.</p>					
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FOR YOU PERSONALLY—HOW TO USE “THE JOURNEY OF HONOR”—50 DAYS OF HONOR TO OUR HEAVENLY FATHER PRAYER CALENDAR

This **Prayer Calendar**, “*The Journey of Honor,*” focuses on the Disciples’ Prayer (often called “The Lord’s Prayer”) in which Jesus focused our attention on coming to the Father, on honoring the Father in every way. Every phrase links back to the **heartbeat** of this prayer—“*Heavenly Father... hallowed be Your Name.*” Let this **Calendar** focus your heart every day, every time in prayer on **your** Heavenly Father. If you **do not yet know** Him as your Father, you can **call on Him now (Romans 10:9-13)**. Turn to Him from any and all sin, anything that’s not His will, and place your faith in the work of His Son Jesus—His death on the Cross, His resurrection from the grave, His enthronement as Lord (Philippians 2:5-11). Give Him your life and in **exchange** receive **His Life and Righteousness** (John 3:15-16; Romans 3:21-26; Titus 3:3-7).

HERE’S HOW DAILY... THE PRAYER CALENDAR has **Seven Focus Points**, one **each day** centered around specific Scriptures. **Each day’s** prayer focuses on one of **seven aspects** of this **Prayer Pattern**. **Each week** also highlights one of the **seven themes** from the Disciples’ Prayer. **Read** the Scripture each day, rolling it over in your mind and heart. What is God **saying**? What should you be **praying**? **Pray** for your life, your family, this church, and for those the Lord brings to mind. Ask God to guide you in **Honoring the Father this day**—in *your* heart, your home, your neighborhood, your work or school, your relationships, with those you meet, in whatever situation that arises *today*. **For example**, the Prayer Scripture for every Tuesday focuses on **Purest Will**, based on “*Your will be done...*” For Tuesday, October 22, the **focus** is on “**The Father’s Will**,” praying for each to know His mighty Power, His real Presence, and His vast Love. Apply that in your life. Remember, you can also use this **Calendar** as part of a **Family Devotion Time**.

Pray 5 Requests: 1) Yourself, 2) Your Family, 3) This Church, 4) Next Lead Pastor, 5) One Other Person. Ask the Lord to show you ways in which **you** can **Honor the Father** in **your** daily life and ways **this local church** can **Honor the Father** in each and every ministry, in each and every age group, in each and every gathering of believers. There are several **Options** as to how to use this Calendar. As a **Whole Church** is one option, seeking the Lord together. An additional Option is being a **Prayer Partner**, praying with another believer for the 50 days (at home, on the phone, etc.). The **Small Group** Option is a way to gather each week. Some will choose a **Day of Prayer with Fasting Option** during this Season of Prayer. Remember, **Read** and **Pray**.
